Threat #2 Poor Mental Health

In Canada, 52% of youth (aged 12-18) experience

depression and **39%**

Threat #5 Vaccine-Preventable Illnesses

25% of children who contract SARS-CoV-2 will develop long-COVID.

National average of children with two doses of a COVID-19

Ages 5 - 11 **42**% Ages 12 - 17 **84%**

Threat #8 Bullving

In Canada, approximately 1 in 3 youth experience bullying.

Evidence shows r (2SLGBTQIA+, immigrants, refugees, and Indigenous youth).2

Threat #3 Systemic Racism and Discrimination

Indigenous children are 12 times more likely to be taken out of their homes and placed in foster care than non-Indigenous children. Source: Fallon et al., 2021

Transgender adolescents

(aged 15-17) are **7.6 times** as likely to have attempted suicide compared to their

Threat #4 Child Abuse

1 in 3 Canadians report experiencing some form of child abuse by the age of 15 This statistic is higher

Threat #6 Poverty and Food and Nutritional Insecurity

Over 1.3 million children in Canada (or about 1 in 5 children) live in poverty. Source: Statistics Canada, 2020; Campaign 2000, 2021

In 2021, approximately

1 in 5 children lived in food insecure households.



Threat #7 Infant Mortality

Canada's infant mortality rate is particularly high compared with other wealthy nations at a rate of

4 infant deaths per 1,000 births

Physical activity and play deteriorated throughout

the COVID-19 pandemic: **Only 12%** of

respondents aged 12 to 17 met the guidelines for moderate-to-vigorous physical activity.



Threat #10 Climate Change



Child acute bronchitis related to wildfires has more than doubled. Asthma symptom days for children aged 5 to 19 have followed a similar trend.
